As a student in our full-time program, you will experience over 900 hands-on clinical hours in skills labs and hospital ambulatory surgery settings.
Upon completion, you will be eligible to take the Certified Surgical Technologist exam.

- We are referred to by many different titles: Operating room technicians, surgical technologists, scrubs, and scrub technicians. The Surgical Technologist is a team member in the operating room under the direct supervision of a qualified professional surgical team. Surgical technologists are responsible for creating and maintaining a sterile surgical field, assisting the surgeon during a procedure, understanding the process, anticipating the surgeon's needs, and maintaining a safe environment for the patient.
- What do Surgical Technologist do? Operating room technicians, surgical technologists, scrubs, and scrub technicians prepare the operating room for surgery by gathering supplies needed to perform the surgery and assist the surgeon by passing items and other sterile supplies. Anticipating the needs of the sterile team members. Thinking ahead to maximize efficiency and flow of the surgical case. Making sure the procedure is executed smoothly and efficiently as possible. Preparing and organizing the operating room. Clean and assist with sterilizing equipment. Surgical technologists work under the supervision of a registered nurse and operating manager.
