Kona Community Hospital Activates Rotor Program

Kona Community Hospital (KCH) welcomed a new emergency medical helicopter as it made its maiden landing on the hospital's helipad on February 14. The Hawaii Life Flight (HLF) crew manning the rotor copter was greeted by KCH administration as well as members of the KCH trauma team, emergency and security departments.

The rotor program at Kona Community Hospital, which officially became operational at 7:00 am on Friday morning, February 15, activated its first emergency transfer at 10:15 am. "This patient is being sent directly to the receiving hospital...there's no ground transportation involved," reported Wendi Wagner, KCH Trauma Coordinator.

HLF has been contracted to operate the American Eurocopter AS350 Be. The helicopter was configured for medical emergency transport prior to arrival on the Big Island. The Thursday landing gave the HLF flight crew a chance to familiarize KCH trauma, emergency and security personnel with the new aircraft. David Steel, Rotor Chief Flight Paramedic and Mark Leggett, Medical Department Chief, showed off medical equipment and other features of the rotor copter and answered questions about its capabilities.

The helicopter, also referred to as an AStar rotor copter, is stationed at Kona International Airport and is dedicated to Kona Community Hospital for facility to facility patient transport. Initially the rotor copter will fly daytime hours only from 7:00am to dark, based on the pilot's discretion and flight turn-around time. Soon, however, the rotor program will provide 24/7 access to emergency transfer from KCH.

The KCH trauma team will coordinate patient transfers with Hawaii Life Flight critical care communications. Once activated, the AStar can make the trip from the airport to KCH in eight minutes. It will cut transit time down from four hours it currently takes to transport a patient to Oahu, to about one hour - depending on weather conditions. As of Tuesday, April 16, HLF has been cleared to land at Maui Memorial Medical Center heliport. The flight to Maui can be made in approximately 35 minutes.

"This is a major accomplishment for Kona Community Hospital and for West Hawaii residents," said Jay Kreuzer, KCH CEO. "We are now able to greatly reduce emergency transit times for patients who require transfer, which in turn will improve outcomes for those patients."

The Talk Story Breaking News: On April 2nd, Kona Community Hospital began renovations to the ceilings and floors on the Med-Surg unit. The project started on the mauka side of the building is progressing up the hall and around to the makai side. Approximately five rooms will be closed at a time to allow construction to take place. Signage is in place to re-route traffic, and when possible an Auxiliary volunteer will be present to direct visitors and patients. Med-Surg and SNF units will both experience intermittent hammering and pounding noise. Please help us to extend sincere appreciation to patients and visitors for their understanding during this time. ###

Kona Community Hospital Infection Rates Decline

At Kona Community Hospital, Healthcare Acquired Infections (HAIs) are trending down across all infection types. The third quarter 2012 HAI Surveillance Report indicated that HAIs have been on the decline at KCH for the entire year.

Of note, in the previous six quarters (572 days), KCH has had no healthcare acquired Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) infections. The intensive care unit (ICU) has had no catheter associated blood stream infections in the past seven months.

HAIs are infections caused by bacteria, fungi or viruses in the course of receiving care in any healthcare setting, including hospitals. KCH Infection Control Director, Lisa Downing, RN says that the hospital has been developing policies and programs that adhere to proven infection prevention measures. Success is due to continued attention to infection prevention protocols by a hospital-wide multidisciplinary team.

"Wherever patient care is provided at KCH, we are focusing on adherence to infection prevention guidelines in order to ensure safe patient care," said Downing. She attributes effective teamwork by all hospital departments. Downing notes, "This is not one department doing a good job. It is a team of dedicated staff working together to reduce infections and provide excellent patient care."

KCH has just wrapped up a two-year collaborative effort with Healthcare Association of Hawaii (HAH). This collaboration was aimed specifically at reducing central line associated bloodstream infections (CLABSI), catheter associated urinary tract infections (CAUTI) and MRSA infections.

Further, in September 2012, the hospital entered into a statewide Surgical Unit Safety Program (SUSP) to target and reduce surgical site infections. This is a 27-month collaborative with Johns Hopkins Medicine, the American College of Surgeons and the World Health Organization.
